An electrotechnical manifesto for the next Government

Gambica has joined forces with another leading electrotechnical trade body, Beama, to draw up a manifesto for the next government. Steve Brambley, deputy director of Gambica*, explains the main elements of this manifesto, which has energy efficiency at its core.

he polls are indicating considerable uncertainty over the outcome of the general election on 7 May, but there is strong support for manufacturing across the political spectrum. Whatever the result, and whichever party or parties form the next government, we can be sure they will be looking to support policies that boost industrial growth, leading to more jobs and economic stability.

Gambica has partnered with another trade association, Beama, to produce a manifesto on behalf of our joint industries - the electrotechnical sector. The paper focuses on the theme of energy efficiency as the most cost-effective energy policy and a means to grow investment, create jobs and export more UK products.

It sets out six areas where we are seeking

Government and industry collaboration
Government and business must work

Engineering skills gap The education system needs to have a greater focus on technology- and sciencebased skills to provide industry with the

talent it needs.

Smart infrastructure policy We want to work in partnership with government to develop a smart energy

infrastructure. This will give industry confidence to invest for the long term.

Key elements of the Gambica/Beama manifesto

government support and partnership to achieve this, with a vision of realising 200TWh of energy savings by 2020 equivalent to 22 new power stations.

That's a massive saving in the amount of generation required, leading to both a significant economic advantage and a major environmental benefit. At the same time as reducing carbon emissions, there will be a cost saving for households, businesses

and industry.

Both industry and government have a role to play in achieving this goal – just as there are alliances between organisations and associations, there needs to be an industry / government partnership to nurture the potential for growth and for economic success. Gambica is also a member of Esco, the Electronic Systems Community, where we are working on an industrial strategy – a coordinated agreement

between industry and government.

So what are we asking a new government for? The six areas where we are seeking support are shown in the table above.
